Description

The International Students of History Association (ISHA) was founded in 1990 and is an academic, non-profit network of students of history and related sciences with members in more than twenty-five European countries. ISHA encourages international and interdisciplinary cooperation and also aims at expanding the dialogue between students and the rest of the scientific community. The session will take place in the form of a round-table and targets both full academics and students who are currently writing their M.A. theses, or recent graduates who are about to start or have just begun their PhD programmes. In general, the session aims at bringing together students and full academics. The round-table is meant to provide insight into these two groups' perspectives on urban history, with preference given to papers or discussion statements that stress international and/or interdisciplinary approaches. Students, on the one hand, will have the chance to attend a large scientific conference, with all obvious benefits thereof (conference experience, networking, the chance to present their work-in-progress and receive feedback). Regular conference participants, on the other hand, will have the opportunity to meet and exchange ideas with committed students from different backgrounds and may also gain additional insight into recent trends in graduate-level urban history research in various countries.
